



Most of the heritage trees that appear in this guide are of easy access for all types of public.

1. THE ASIN DE BROTO OAK

An easy signed route running downhill for 15 minutes from the village of Asín de Broto along a path leading straight down to the tree. It's the PR-HU 118 footpath that leads to Fiscal. You'll need 25 minutes to get back up to the village.

2. THE CRAPERA YEWS

A medium level signed route through a gorgeous forest with large impressive Yews over a hundred years of age. The starting point is from the Bujaruelo refuge, 3 hours there and back.

3. THE MIRONA YEW

A medium level signed route starting out from the San Urbez car park. A gradual climb of 350 metres for an hour and a half one way. This specimen has a 3 metre circumference at its base and is 15 metres high. It's located in the Añisclo gorge within the Ordesa and Monte Perdido National Park.

4. THE LECINA HOLLY OAK

An easy signed route leading to one of Spain's largest and oldest trees. Over 1000 years old, this tree was voted "European Tree of the year 2021". It's a 10 minute walk from the car park in the village of Lecina.

5 · THE CASTRO OAK

An easy signed route 400 metres from the road between Troncedo and Tierrantona leading to a huge, spectacular Oak.

6 · THE VILLAMANA HOLLY OAK

An easy signed route just 5 minutes from the access track to San Martín de la Solana. Another fabulous example of this species in Sobrarbe.

7 • THE SMALL FOREST OF OTO "LA MOSQUERA DE OTO"

An easy signed route directly accessible from the road behind the Oto campsite. An outstanding piece of woodland rife with tree sized Boxwood and other species that stand out for their size and shape.

8 · THE PARDINA DEL SEÑOR FOREST

You can access this forest from the road between Fanlo and Sarvisé. It is considered to be one of the twelve most beautiful woods in Spain to visit in autumn, when its colours are at their best. You can venture into it along footpaths.

9. THE "PUENTE PECADORES" LINDEN TREES

An easy route from the road between San Juan de Plan and Gistaín. These monumental Linden trees are in the municipality of San Juan de Plan, in the gorge around the spectacular "Puente Pecadores" bridge which spans a sheer drop down to the river. There are more than 10 specimens in this breath-taking spot, some of them over 25 metres high.

10. THE PINETA BEECH WOOD

This is an easy path from the Pineta meadow in the Ordesa and Monte Perdido National Park. Here, in this spectacular glacial cirque, you'll find densely populated Beech woods covering the slopes of the valley, which has been declared a "Green Valley".

11. THE BAGÜESTE CENTENARY OAK

An easy and well signed route which there and back takes a total of 4 hours. It's 11 kms in total and it takes you past 29 huge, spectacular Oaks and through villages of Viello Sobrarbe.

12 · THE FANFRIA FIR TREE IN FISCAL

A medium level route in the Yeba de Basa municipality, accessible from Fiscal along the Cancías track.
